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'The governor, with the advice of the council, may license not exceeding 35 50 detectives for the detection, prevention and punishment of crime, to serve for the term of 4 years, unless such license is sooner revoked for cause.'

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## Chapter 27

### AN ACT to Establish Date for Arbor Day.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 11, § 11, repealed and replaced. Section 11 of chapter 11 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 11. National Arbor Day. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the last Friday in April as National Arbor Day, recommending its observance by the public in the planting of trees, shrubs and vines, in the promotion of forest growth and culture, in the adornment of public and private grounds, places and ways, and in such other efforts and undertakings as shall harmonize with the general character of the day. He shall further recommend that such day be observed in rural and suburban schools by exercises appropriate to National Arbor Day.'

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## Chapter 28

### AN ACT Relating to Territory Included in the Maine Forestry District.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 32, § 73, amended. Section 73 of chapter 32 of the revised statutes, as amended by section 24 of chapter 41 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 73. Maine Forestry District. The administrative district known as the Maine Forestry District, heretofore established and incorporated, shall include the following territory:
