Chapter 46

AN ACT Relating to Issuing of Licenses for the Carrying of Concealed Weapons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 124, § 18, amended. Section 18 of chapter 124 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding after the 2nd sentence thereof a new sentence to read as follows:

'If such applicant is a resident of the state and is domiciled in unorganized territory, such certificate may be issued by the police or city marshal of any city or the selectmen of any town nearest to the unorganized territory.'

Chapter 47

AN ACT Relating to the County Law Library of Piscataquis County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 151, amended. That part of section 151 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to payment to the county law library association of Piscataquis county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Piscataquis, ~~\$500~~ \$800.'

Chapter 48

AN ACT Relating to Apportionments from School Funds.

R. S., c. 37, § 211-A, amended. Section 211-A of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 24 of chapter 350 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 211-A. Apportionments to be made in December; exception. All apportionments to cities ~~and~~, towns, plantations, academies and institutes

under the provisions of this chapter, unless specifically directed by statute, shall be made annually in December, except that whenever the commissioner of education is satisfied that a financial need exists, and with the approval of the treasurer of state, an amount not to exceed $\frac{2}{3}$ of the estimated subsidy may be paid on or after September 15.'

Chapter 49

AN ACT Relating to Duty of Superintendent of Schools Concerning Habitual Truants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 86, amended. Section 86 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 86. Habitual truant; attendance officer to make complaint. If a child without sufficient excuse is habitually and wilfully absent from school or fails without such excuse to attend school for 5 day sessions or for 10 half-day sessions within any period of 6 months, he shall be deemed an habitual truant; and the superintendent of schools or the superintending school committee shall notify him and any person under whose control he may be that, unless he conforms to section 83, the provisions of the 2 following sections will be enforced against them; and if thereafter such child continues irregular in attendance, the attendance officers or any of them shall, when so directed by the superintending school committee or superintendent, in writing, enforce said provisions by complaint.'

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
