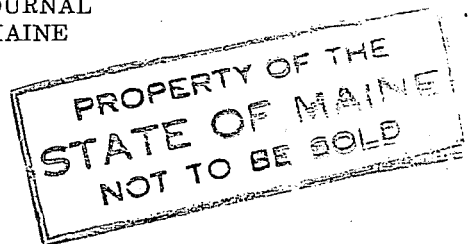

Chapter 88

AN ACT Relating to Credit for Returns of Malt Liquor Bottles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 55, amended. The last sentence of the 1st paragraph of section 55 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Nothing herein contained shall prohibit a licensee from giving credit to a purchaser for the actual price charged for packages or original containers ~~to be returned by the original purchaser~~ as a credit on any sale, or from ~~refunding to a purchaser paying the amount actually paid by such purchaser~~ charged for packages or original containers.'

Effective August 6, 1949 .

Chapter 89

AN ACT Relating to Agricultural Societies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 16, amended. The 7th sentence of section 16 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 366 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'No society shall receive any portion of the stipend in excess of ~~\$5,000~~ \$10,000.'

Chapter 90

AN ACT Relating to Election of Presidential Electors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 4, § 16, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 16 of chapter 4 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'At any such state convention the political party so represented shall formulate and adopt its declaration of principles, or platform, for the state elec-

tion then next ensuing, nominate as many presidential electors as the state is entitled to, elect a state committee, a district committee for each congressional district, and a county committee for each county, severally of such number and to be elected in such manner as the convention may determine.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 4, § 16, amended. Section 16 of chapter 4 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting before the last sentence thereof a new sentence, to read as follows:

'All vacancies in the number of presidential electors shall be filled by the state committee.'

Chapter 91

AN ACT Relating to Reemployment Rights of State Employees in Armed Forces.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 59, § 23, amended. Section 23 of chapter 59 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'The provisions of this section shall apply to any such employee entering the armed forces of the United States under the provisions of Public Law 759, 80th Congress (Selective Service Act of 1948) or while said Public Law 759 or any amendment thereto or extension thereof shall be in effect.'

Chapter 92

AN ACT Relating to Retirement Fund of State Employees in Armed Forces.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 60, § 3, sub-§ VI, amended. Subsection VI of section 3 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes, as revised by section 3 of chapter 384 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'VI. Should any member in any period of 15 consecutive years, after
