## Chapter 155

### AN ACT Relating to State Registered Bonds.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 15, § 17, amended. The last sentence of section 17 of chapter 15 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Said bonds shall bear the facsimile of the signature of the governor, and shall be signed by the treasurer and attested by the ~~state auditor~~ commissioner of finance, with the seal of the state affixed.'

## Chapter 156

### AN ACT Relating to the Practice of Optometry.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 68, § 1, sub-§ VII, additional. Section 1 of chapter 68 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered VII, to read as follows:

'VII. Registration in optometry,'

## Chapter 157

### AN ACT Relating to Payment to York County Law Library.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 79, § 151, amended. That part of section 151 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to York county, as repealed and replaced by chapter 253 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'York, ~~\$1,250~~ \$1,750.'
