L. Conviction of the violation of the provisions of section 32 of the United States liquor taxing act of 1934 relating to having in possession distilled spirits in unstamped containers;

Chapter 193

AN ACT Authorizing Cities and Towns to Appropriate Money for Volunteer Fire Departments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 80, § 91, amended. Section 91 of chapter 80 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 40 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:

'They may also raise money for the support and maintenance of a duly incorporated volunteer fire department.'

Chapter 194

AN ACT Relative to Careless Shooting of Human Being.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 125, amended. Section 125 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 125. Carelessly shooting human being while engaged in hunting; penalty. Whoever while on a hunting trip, or in the pursuit of wild game or game birds, negligently or carelessly shoots and wounds, or kills any human being, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000, or by
