Sec. 2. **Limitations.** Sections 142 and 143 of chapter 56 of the revised statutes of Maine, 1944, declared to be amended by this act, shall remain in full force and effect for the preservation of all rights to receive and all obligations to pay pensions and other benefits by virtue of plans or systems heretofore established pursuant to the provisions of said sections.

Chapter 305

AN ACT Relating to State Aid for Academies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 106, sub-§ III, additional. Section 106 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 336 of the public laws of 1945 and by chapter 124 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby further amended by adding there a new subsection III, to read as follows:

'III. In determining annual income from invested funds, as used in this section, all income from such funds limited by their terms, or in their use to major repairs or new construction of buildings, purchase of additional real estate, or major items of equipment, any or all of which are used in the operation of said academy as a going concern, or in addition thereto used for items of expense not considered by the state department of education in determining the annual cost per pupil, shall be excluded.'

Chapter 306

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire in County Offices in Somerset County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 269, amended. That part of section 269 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to clerk hire in Somerset county, as amended by section 7 of chapter 280 of the public laws of 1945, and by chapter 293 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Somerset county: for clerks in the office of register of deeds, ~~\$3,800~~ \$4,800; for clerks in the office of register of probate, ~~\$1,500~~ \$2,000; for

clerks in the office of clerk of courts, ~~\$2,000~~ \$2,500, and such additional amounts as may be authorized by the county commissioners.'

Chapter 307

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Clerk of Courts of Knox County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 114, amended. That part of section 114 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to Knox county, as amended by section 1 of chapter 262 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Knox, ~~\$2,400~~ \$2,700,'

Chapter 308

AN ACT Relating to Increase of Salaries of Certain County Officials of Knox County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 79, § 6, amended. That part of section 6 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 186 of the public laws of 1945, which relates to the salary of the county commissioners of Knox county, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Knox, ~~\$600~~ \$800,'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 79, § 146, amended. That part of section 146 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, which relates to the salary of the county treasurer of Knox county, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Knox, ~~\$500~~ \$700,'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 79, § 165, amended. That part of section 165 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 262 of the public laws of 1945, which relates to the salary of the sheriff of Knox county, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Knox, ~~\$2,000~~ \$2,200,'
