SALARY OF THE SHERIFF OF WALDO COUNTY

CHAP. 331

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PUBLIC LAWS, 1949

'Sec. 6. Commission to lay out state and state aid highway system; surveys. The commission shall lay out, construct and maintain a system of state and state aid highways substantially as described in this chapter. All persons employed by the commission under the provisions of this chapter are authorized to the extent necessary for surveys and preliminary engineering to enter and cross all lands within, adjoining and adjacent to the area to be surveyed.'

Chapter 329

AN ACT Relating to Boards of Registration.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 3, § 13, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 13 of chapter 3 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 347 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'In cities of 35,000 39,000 inhabitants or more, the chairman of the board shall receive $\frac{2}{300}$ \$2,450 per year and the other 2 members of the board shall receive $\frac{1}{51,950}$ \$2,100 per year.'

Chapter 330

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Clerk of Courts of Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 114, amended. That part of section 114 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, which relates to the salary of the clerk of courts of Waldo county, as amended by section 1 of chapter 322 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Waldo, \$1,800 \$2,250,'

Chapter 331

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Sheriff of Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 165, amended. That part of section 165 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salary of the sheriff of Waldo

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county, as amended by section 4 of chapter 322 of the public laws of 1945. is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Waldo, \$1,800 \$2,250,'

Chapter 332

AN ACT Relating to Pollution of Tidal Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 72, § 6, amended. The 1st sentence of section 6 of chapter 72 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 3 of chapter 266 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person, corporation or other party shall place or deposit, in a manner and an extent inconsistent with the public interest, in the inland waters or tidal waters of this state, or on the banks thereof in such a manner so that the same shall fall or be washed into such waters, any slabs, edgings, sawdust, chips, bark, mill waste, shavings or fibrous materials created in the manufacture of lumber or other wood products, or so deposit any oil regardless of its source, or so pollute said waters in manner and extent inconsistent with the public interest.'

Chapter 333

AN ACT Relating to Funeral Directors and Embalmers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 187, amended. Section 187 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 187. Business of funeral director and practice of embalming regulated; qualifications. Any person wishing to become an embalmer of dead human bodies for burial shall be at least 21 years of age, with not less than a high school education or its equivalent, be a citizen of the United States, shall have practiced embalming, caring for and preparing for burial, dead human bodies, for at least 2 years, and shall have embalmed a minimum
