Chapter 332

AN ACT Relating to Pollution of Tidal Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 72, § 6, amended. The 1st sentence of section 6 of chapter 72 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 3 of chapter 266 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person, corporation or other party shall place or deposit, in a manner and an extent inconsistent with the public interest, in the inland waters or tidal waters of this state, or on the banks thereof in such a manner so that the same shall fall or be washed into such waters, any slabs, edgings, sawdust, chips, bark, mill waste, shavings or fibrous materials created in the manufacture of lumber or other wood products, or so deposit any oil regardless of its source, or so pollute said waters in manner and extent in consistent with the public interest.'

Chapter 333

AN ACT Relating to Funeral Directors and Embalmers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 187, amended. Section 187 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 187. Business of funeral director and practice of embalming regulated; qualifications. Any person wishing to become an embalmer of dead human bodies for burial shall be at least 21 years of age, with not less than a high school education or its equivalent, be a citizen of the United States, shall have practiced embalming, caring for and preparing for burial, dead human bodies, for at least 2 years, and shall have embalmed a minimum
