Chapter 350

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of Clerks in the Office of Recorder of the Portland Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 269, amended. The 4th paragraph of section 269 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 225 of the public laws of 1945 and by chapter 254 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby further amended so that said paragraph, so far as it relates to the amount to be paid for clerk hire in the office of the recorder of the Portland municipal court shall read as follows:

'for clerks in the office of the recorder of the Portland municipal court, \$3,744 \$4,576, and for special clerk hire, \$1,500, said sum of \$1,500 to be available for a period of 2 years only;'

Chapter 351

AN ACT Relating to Wholesale Lobster Dealer's License.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 114, amended. The 2nd and 3rd paragraphs of section 114 of chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby amended to read as follows:

'The fee for a license, designated as a wholesale lobster dealer's license, shall be \$50 \$35 and shall entitle the holder to buy and sell and transport fresh fish, shellfish and lobsters in wholesale trade within the state and to ship the same within and outside the state.
