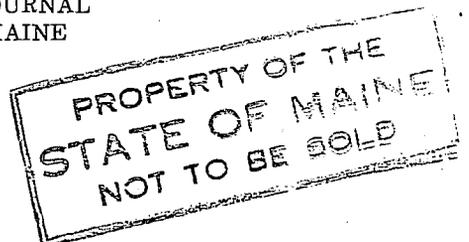

Private and Special Laws

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE

private and special laws of 1929, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 4. Ordinance for adjusting pensions. The city of Portland is further authorized to provide by ordinance for adjusting pensions of members of the police and fire departments, and in order to carry into effect such adjustment, said city of Portland is hereby authorized to pay to such members of the police and fire departments, as are on the pension rolls, an added amount, so that a pension of \$3 per day may be paid to men, who, at the time of their retirement, held the rank of private or patrolman; \$3.25 per day may be paid to men, who, at the time of their retirement, held the rank of lieutenant or engineer; and \$3.50 per day may be paid to men, who, at the time of their retirement, held the rank of captain or deputy chief. The provisions of this section shall not apply to call members of the fire department now on the pension rolls, nor to members of the police or fire departments now on the pension rolls, who are now receiving a pension greater than they would receive under the provisions of this section.'

Chapter 38

AN ACT Enlarging the Territory of the Parsonsfield Kezar Falls Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1911, c. 216, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 216 of the private and special laws of 1911 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Territorial limits. That part of the territory of the town of Parsonsfield in the county of York, embraced within the limits described as follows: Commencing on the southerly bank of the Ossipee river parallel with line of land of Sokokis Lumber Company and P. W. Benton west of Sokokis Lumber Company's mill; thence southerly near said line to include P. W. Benton's homestead; thence northerly and easterly through Kezar Falls, parallel with and 50 rods south of road leading through Kezar Falls to Cornish village to the road leading to George E. Davis' residence; thence due north by said road to the brook; thence easterly by said brook to the Devereaux road, so called; thence easterly a line parallel with and 300 feet south of Ossipee Trail, so called, a distance of 1,200 feet; thence due north to the Ossipee river.'

Referendum; effective date. This act shall take effect 90 days after the adjournment of the legislature, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Parsonsfield Kezar Falls Village Corporation at its annual or special meeting to be held before May, 1950, and to the legal voters of the territory included in such grant. The corporation clerk shall prepare the required ballots, upon which he shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question: "Shall 'An Act Enlarging the Territory of the Parsonsfield Kezar Falls Village Corporation' be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed over the word "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. This act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the voters voting at said meeting. The result of the vote shall be declared by the corporation clerk and a certificate thereof filed by the corporation clerk with the secretary of state.

Chapter 39

AN ACT Increasing the Number of Trustees for the Maine Maritime Academy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1941, c. 37, § 1, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 1 of chapter 37 of the private and special laws of 1941 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The affairs of the school shall be controlled by a board of ~~9~~ 12 trustees, all residents of the state of Maine, who, together with their successors, shall be appointed by the governor of the state of Maine, with the advice and consent of his council. In the first instance, 3 trustees shall be appointed for terms of 1 year, 3 for terms of 2 years and 3 for terms of 3 years. **The appointment of the 3 additional trustees shall be as follows: 1 trustee shall be appointed for a term of 1 year, 1 for a term of 2 years and 1 for a term of 3 years.** Thereafter ~~3~~ 4 of the 12 trustees shall be appointed annually to serve for terms of 3 years, or until their successors are duly appointed and qualified. Any vacancy in the board shall be filled by appointment by the governor for the remainder of the unexpired term, but the majority of the board shall carry on business during the existence of any vacancy on the board.'
