Chapter 46

AN ACT Relating to Park and Recreation Commission of City of South Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1933, c. 55, Article 12, § 7, amended. Section 7 of Article 12 of chapter 55 of the private and special laws of 1933, as enacted by chapter 61 of the private and special laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 7. Borrow money. Said commission ~~in the name of the city~~, with the approval by vote of the city council, shall have the power to borrow money and give notes or other evidences of indebtedness therefor, to carry on the work herein designated, which shall be repaid out of the fund herein established, but the city shall not be liable for the payment of any money so borrowed beyond the amount in said fund or deposited in said fund from time to time under the provisions of ~~section~~ sections 8 and 9 hereof. Any money borrowed by vote of the commission shall be repaid from said fund in the manner provided under the terms of the loan, and any installment, when due and payable, shall be a first lien on said fund.'

Chapter 47

AN ACT to Incorporate the Trustees of Franco American Oblate Fathers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Trustees of Franco American Oblate Fathers incorporated. Eugene J. LaBrie, Arthur W. St. Cyr, Lucien Dufault, Joseph Morrissette, Maurice Savard, Leo Desmarais and Anatole Baillargeon, their associates and successors, are hereby appointed and constituted trustees of a body politic and corporate to be known as the Franco American Oblate Fathers, Inc., which shall be and remain a charitable, religious and educational body corporate by that name forever.

Sec. 2. Powers; privileges; seal; by-laws; hold property. Said corporation is hereby vested with all the rights, privileges and immunities incident to like and similar corporations; may have and use a common seal; prosecute and defend suits at law and in equity; make, ordain and establish
