TO ESTABLISH THE BREWER MUNICIPAL COURT PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1949

Chapter 87

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Recorder of the Augusta Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1919, c. 75, § 12, amended. Section 12 of chapter 75 of the private and special laws of 1919, as amended by chapter 127 of the private and special laws of 1921, and chapter 145 of the private and special laws of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 12. Recorder; duties, compensation. The governor with the advice and consent of his council shall appoint a recorder who shall be a justice of the peace for said county duly qualified, and who shall be duly sworn, and in case of absence, sickness, or disqualification of the judge, or in the event of a vacancy of the office of judge, or at any other time at the request of said judge in order to expedite business, shall have the same powers as said judge. Said recorder shall be appointed for a term of 4 years, and until his successor has duly qualified, and as compensation in full for his services shall receive \$200 \$1,000 per year, payable by the city of Augusta county of Kennebec in the same manner as the salary of said judge.'

Chapter 88

AN ACT to Establish the Brewer Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Name; location; judge. A municipal court is hereby established at Brewer, in the county of Penobscot, which shall be called the "Brewer Municipal Court." It shall be a court of record and have a seal. It shall consist of I judge. The judge shall be a member of the bar and shall reside in Penobscot county. He shall be appointed and shall give bond in accordance with the constitution and laws of this state. His salary shall be \$1,500 per year, to be paid monthly from the treasury of the county of Penobscot.

Sec. 2. Duties of judge as to records; to account for money paid in; give bond. The duties of the judge shall include such duties as are performed by clerks of the superior court, so far as applicable. He shall
