CHAP. 217

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 217

AN ACT to Appropriate Monies to Supplement Appropriations for the Expenditures of State Government and to Appropriate Monies for Other Purposes for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1951.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Emergency appropriations. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951, the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulations, are hereby appropriated out of the unappropriated surplus of the general fund. Appropriations for the 1951 fiscal year shall become effective July 1, 1950. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the governor and council based upon work programs submitted to the commissioner of finance, the state controller shall authorize expenditures on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise; and be it further provided that all appropriations
