### **Chapter 10**

#### RESOLVE in Favor of the Town of Washburn.

Town of Washburn; appropriation for. Resolved: That the money appropriated in favor of the town of Washburn by the 93rd legislature for the fiscal years 1947-1948 and 1948-1949 for repairing the Du-Four road, so called, be, and hereby is, reappropriated in favor of the town of Washburn to be expended for the fiscal years 1949-50 and 1950-51 in repairing the Caribou lake road, so called.

### Chapter 11

#### **RESOLVE** in Favor of the Town of Appleton.

Town of Appleton; appropriation for. Resolved: That the money appropriated in favor of the town of Appleton by the 93rd legislature for the fiscal year 1948-49 for repairing the road leading from Belfast turn, so called, on route No. 131 to Pitman's corner, so called, on Appleton Ridge, be and hereby is reappropriated in favor of the town of Appleton to be expended for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950, in repairing the Ridge road, so called, leading from Pease corner through Pitman's corner, so called, to Searsmont town line.

### Chapter 12

#### RESOLVE to Open Third Debsconeag Lake in T. 1, R. 10 and T. 2, R. 10, Piscataquis County to Ice Fishing.

Third Debsconeag lake opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Third Debsconeag lake, in T. I, R. IO and T. 2, R. IO, Piscataquis county, to ice fishing from the time ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring.
