Chapter 68

RESOLVE, Opening Upper and Lower Macwahoc Lakes, Aroostook County, to Ice Fishing.

Upper and Lower Macwahoc lakes opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to open Upper Macwahoc lake in the town of Sherman and Lower Macwahoc lake in T 2, R 4, Aroostook county, to ice fishing.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 69

RESOLVE Opening Deer Pond, in the Town of Hollis, York County, to Fishing.

Deer pond; opened to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Deer pond, in the town of Hollis, York county, to fishing, on May 1st, with a daily bag limit of 5 trout per person per day.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 70

RESOLVE, Closing the Tributaries to Great Moose Pond to Fishing.

Tributaries to Great Moose pond, closed. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close to all fishing Brown brook, Goodwin brook, Lemon stream, Tuttle stream and Higgins stream as far as Bartlett's Dam which are tributaries to Great Moose pond, Somerset county, for a period of 2 years.

RESOLVE Authorizing the Sale of Feeding Station Property in the County of Aroostook.

Sale of feeding station property authorized. Resolved: That the state tax assessor be, and hereby is, authorized to sell for the department of

inland fisheries and game the land in the town of Washburn, formerly occupied by the Presque Isle feeding station, to the Presque Isle fish and game association at a price to be established by the governor and council.

RESOLVE Regulating Fishing in Snake and Carpenter Ponds in the County of Piscataquis.

Regulating fishing in Snake and Carpenter ponds in the county of Piscataquis. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Snake and Carpenter ponds, T. 7, R. 11, W. E. L. S., in the county of Piscataquis, to all fishing except fly fishing and trolling.

Chapter 73

RESOLVE Regulating Fishing in Pleasant and Mud Lakes in the County of Penobscot.

Regulating fishing in Pleasant and Mud lakes in the county of Penobscot. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Pleasant and Mud lakes, T. 6, R. 6, W. E. L. S., in the county of Penobscot and all tributaries thereto to all fishing except fly fishing and trolling.

Chapter 74

RESOLVE, to Open Plunkett Pond, Aroostook County, to Ice Fishing.

Plunkett pond opened to ice fishing. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Plunkett pond, in the town of Benedicta, county of Aroostook, to ice fishing.
