Chapter 80

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Long Pond in the County of Franklin.

Regulating fishing in Long pond, in the county of Franklin. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing tributaries to Long pond, in Sandy River plantation, in the county of Franklin, to all fishing.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 81

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Kemankeag Pond in the County of Franklin.

Regulating fishing in Kemankeag pond, in the county of Franklin. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Kemankeag pond, T. 3, R. 3, W. B. K. P., in the county of Franklin, to all fishing except fly fishing, and closing all tributaries.

Chapter 82

RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at Outlet of North Pond, in the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Oxford.

Outlet of North pond; screening of. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby authorized to establish a screen at the outlet of North pond in the town of Woodstock, in the county of Oxford, the expense of this screen to be borne by the Mt. Abram Fish and Game Association, Inc., who shall agree to keep the same free of leaves and all debris.

Chapter 83

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Brassua Lake in the County of Somerset.

Regulating fishing in Brassua lake, in the county of Somerset. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue the following rules and regulations:

- I. Establishing a point which for the purpose of the fishing laws shall be the point which is the confluence of Misery stream and Brassua lake,

in T. 1 and 2, R. 2, N. B. K. P., and cause red posts to be set on each shore at this point, closing the area above this point to all fishing.

II. Establishing a point at which 2 yellow posts shall be placed at Brassua lake, one at a point near Misery Sands, so called, and one in a northwest direction on the opposite shore from Misery Sands, closing to all fishing after August 15 of each year that area from a line between the yellow posts to a line between the red posts at the mouth of Misery stream.

Chapter 84

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Certain Somerset County Waters.

Regulating fishing in certain Somerset county waters. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of not more than 10 trout nor more than 5 pounds in the aggregate taken from any or all the following waters: Heald pond, Wee Heald pond, Heald bog and Robbinson pond, all in Caratunk plantation; Chase pond and Chase bog, in the town of Moscow and Chase stream in Caratunk plantation and in the town of Moscow, all in the county of Somerset.

Chapter 85

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in and Closing Tributaries to Lake Maranacook and Narrows Pond, in the County of Kennebec.

Fishing in Lake Maranacook and Narrows pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close the tributaries of Lake Maranacook and Narrows pond, in the county of Kennebec, to all fishing, and to establish April 15th as the opening date for fishing in Lake Maranacook and Narrows pond, in the county of Kennebec.

Chapter 86

RESOLVE, Closing Lake Cobbosseecontee in Kennebec County to Fishing Through the Ice for Salmon and Trout.

Lake Cobbosseecontee closed to ice fishing for salmon and trout. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Lake
