Chapter 105

RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at Outlet of Lake Auburn in the City of Auburn.

Outlet of Lake Auburn; screening of. Resolved: That the sum of \$753.11 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game for installing a fish screen at the outlet of Lake Auburn in the city of Auburn, in the county of Androscoggin; provided that the Androscoggin County Fish and Game Association shall assume all liability for the maintenance of said screen and for keeping of said screen free from all sticks, leaves and debris so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same; and provided further that the state shall be liable for only $\frac{1}{2}$ the cost of said screen.

Chapter 106

RESOLVE Providing for a Fish Screen at Outlet of Great Pond in Plantation No. 33, Hancock County.

Outlet of Great pond; screening of. Resolved: That the sum of \$655.68 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game, for installing a fish screen on the west branch of Union river at the outlet of Great pond in Plantation No. 33, Hancock county; provided, however, that Frank Honey, of Plantation No. 33, shall assume all liability for the maintenance of said screen and for keeping of said screen free from all sticks, leaves and debris so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same; and provided further that the state shall be liable for only $\frac{1}{2}$ the cost of said screen.
