RESOLVE Regulating Fishing in Donnell's Pond in the County of Hancock.

Regulating fishing in Donnell's pond in the county of Hancock. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing the tributaries of Donnell's pond in the town of Franklin, in the county of Hancock, to all fishing.
