Chapter 156

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Jefferson.

Town of Jefferson; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$384 from the funds of the department of education to be paid to the town of Jefferson to reimburse said town for transportation of school children who were boarded by the state.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Edward D. McKeon of Kennebunk.

Edward D. McKeon; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$417 from the general fund of the state to be paid to Edward D. McKeon, of Kennebunk, for cost of an artificial arm and hand.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Harold E. Rogers of Brunswick.

Harold E. Rogers; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$567.20 to be paid to Harold E. Rogers of Brunswick, to reimburse him for hospital and medical expenses paid by him for his son, Norman Rogers, who became ill while in the National Guard; such appropriation to be paid from the funds of the adjutant general's department.
