Chapter 177

RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys for Certain Construction, Repairs and Equipment at Certain State Institutions.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, certain construction, repairs and equipment at several state institutions are vitally necessary and should be completed immediately; and

Whereas, such construction, repairs and equipment will result in better well-being and health for the inmates of such institutions; and

Whereas, if the work is done immediately, future heavier repairs will be prevented resulting in greater savings to the people of Maine; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Construction, repairs and equipment at certain state institutions. Resolved: That the sum of \$85,000 be, and hereby is, reappropriated from the unexpended balance of the appropriation provided under the provisions of chapter 29 of the resolves of 1945 to be expended for the construction and repairs at certain state institutions for the purposes enumerated under their names in the amount set forth for such construction, repairs and equipment:

Pownal state school

Purchase and installation of an auxiliary boiler,
extension of boiler house and other incidental work \$38,000

Reformatory for women

Construction of a hen house \$ 3,500
Construction of a young stock building 10,000
Equipment and ventilation 800

Total 14,300

State school for boys

Purchase and installation of a stoker and
boiler repairs 3,000

State school for girls

Heating plant repairs and purchase and installation
of stokers where necessary

7,000

School for the deaf

Construction of fire escapes

2,000

Purchase and installation of toilet facilities

1,000

Purchase and installation of kitchen range

900

Resolved: That such moneys shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 178

RESOLVE Authorizing Donald S. Porter of Lowell to Sue the State of Maine.

Donald S. Porter given right to sue state. Resolved: That Donald S. Porter, of Lowell, in the county of Penobscot and state of Maine, who suffered, on the 31st day of October, 1946, serious personal injuries while a passenger in an automobile being operated on a Maine highway, to wit, State road route No. 188, between said Lowell and the town of Enfield in said county and state, due, as he claims, to the failure of the state to properly maintain a certain iron pipe fence by and along said highway route No. 188 in said town of Lowell, and in permitting said iron fence to fall into a state of disrepair, be, and he hereby is, authorized to bring a suit at law in the superior court for the county of Penobscot within 1 year from the 1st
