COMPLETION AND PRINTING A DIGEST OF OPINIONS OF LAW COURT 1335 RESOLVES, 1949 CHAP. 186

"Shall the constitution be amended as proposed by a resolution of the legislature to authorize the issuing of bonds in an amount not exceeding \$7,000,000 to be used for the purpose of building a combination highway and railroad bridge across Fore river as authorized by the legislature?"

And the inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations shall vote by ballot on said question, those in favor of the amendment voting "Yes" upon their ballots and those opposed to the amendment voting "No" upon their ballots and the ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and return made to the office of the secretary of state in the same manner as votes for governor and members of the legislature and the governor and council shall count the same and if it shall appear that a majority of the inhabitants voting on the question are in favor of the amendment, the governor shall forthwith make known the fact by his proclamation and the amendment shall thereupon, as of the date of said proclamation, become a part of the constitution.

Secretary of state shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the secretary of state shall prepare and furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations ballots and blank returns in conformity with the foregoing resolve accompanied by a copy thereof.

RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Erna G. Adams of Bridgton.

Teacher's pension granted to Erna G. Adams. Resolved: That Erna G. Adams, of Bridgton, be given credit for an additional 2 years of teaching service so that she may be entitled to a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

Completion and printing of digest, authorized. Resolved: That the attorney-general be, and hereby is, authorized and instructed to complete the compilation of a digest of the opinions of the law court of the state of

RESOLVES, 1949

Maine authorized under the provisions of chapter 105, resolves of 1945, in such order and form as shall seem best to him after taking the opinions of the members of the bar of the state. To aid him in the completion and printing of this work, he is empowered to employ one or more competent and experienced members of the bar with such clerical assistance as may be necessary; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the governor and council are hereby authorized to provide for the printing and sale and fixing the price of the digest, to the end that as nearly as possible the expense to the state shall be defrayed. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this resolve the sum of \$12,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950, is hereby appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund of the state. Any unexpended balances shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

Chapter 187

RESOLVE in Favor of a Bridge Across the St. John River in Allagash Plantation.

Bridge to be constructed over St. John river. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$100,000 to aid in building a bridge across the St. John river in Allagash plantation, at or near the "present ferry site", this bridge to be built under the bridge act, so called; and be it further

Resolved: That any unexpended balance shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished; and be it further

Resolved: That after the construction of such bridge, Allagash plantation shall pay to the state \$5,000 per year for 10 successive years; such money to be credited to the general highway fund.
