Payment of the pensions herein provided to Lloyd L. Arnold, Thomas Bard, Melvin Steven Belden, Lawrence Bosse, Myrtle Brewer, Charles Ora Butters, Robert Callman, Artell Cookson, John Dean, Delores Demchak, John Ellis, Robert Arlo Fogg, Omer Garneau, Jr., Carlene Hanson, Beulah Louise Ladd, Esther Ann McDonald, Fred Oliver, Hugh O'Riley, Eddie D. Ouellette, Chester Simpson, Charles Smith, Nellie Whitehead, shall be made only after a court of competent jurisdiction has determined under the provisions of law the need for the appointment of a conservator or guardian.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 195

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Wallagrass Plantation for Support of the Family of Edward Berube.

Wallagrass plantation; reimbursed. Resolved: That the state controller be, and hereby is, authorized to charge off from the books of the state the sum of \$1,170.95, now charged to Wallagrass plantation for support of the family of Edward Berube.

Chapter 196

RESOLVE, in Favor of New England Telephone and Telegraph Company, of Augusta.

New England Telephone and Telegraph Company; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$41.87 from

the general fund of the state to be paid to New England Telephone and Telegraph Company, of Augusta, to reimburse said company for the cost of replacing a telephone pole.

Chapter 197

RESOLVE for Preliminary Investigation of Quoddy Project.

Quoddy project; preliminary investigation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund of the state the sum of \$30,000 to be expended with the approval of the governor and council for a preliminary investigation of the Quoddy project. This money shall be used by the Joint International Boundary Commission.

Chapter 198

RESOLVE, in Favor of Louise W. Cony, of Augusta.

Louise W. Cony; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$31 from the general relief fund of the department of health and welfare, to be paid to Louise W. Cony, of Augusta, as a full and final settlement of her claim against the state for damage done to her iron fence by a truck from Jefferson Camp.

Chapter 199

RESOLVE, Providing for the Payment of Certain Damages Caused by Protected Wild Animals.

Damages caused by deer and moose to automobiles and crops, provided for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$21,551.62 from the funds of department of inland fisheries and game to be paid to certain persons, as a full and final settlement for their claims
