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#### PREFACE

The changes in the session laws passed by the 94th legislature are indicated in the following manner:

I. In deleting certain words from a law, unless the words are repealed by express language, the words are printed with lines drawn through them.

II. In adding new words, the new words are printed in boldface type (boldface type 10 point).

III. In repealing and replacing a section or sections, the new section or sections are printed in boldface type (boldface type 10 point).

The table of contents at the beginning of this volume shows the location of the various laws, tables and indexes. State papers, such as addresses, executive orders, proclamations of the Governor and gifts of Ex-Governor Baxter to the state are not indexed but may be located by reference to the table of contents.

The tenth biennial revision of the inland fish and game laws and the second biennial revision of the sea and shore fisheries laws are printed at the end of this volume.

A cross reference table will be found toward the end of the volume showing the public laws enacted at the special sessions of the 91st legislature and the sections of the revised statutes of 1944 which have been affected by laws passed at the 92nd, 93rd and 94th legislatures. All public laws passed by the 92nd, 93rd and 94th legislatures have been allocated and it is hoped that this procedure may be continued in the future to prevent confusion.

One new feature added in the session laws of 1945 has been retained. At the top of each page there is indicated whether the law is public, private and special or a resolve and the session year during which the law was passed. It is hoped thereby that all information concerning any law may be found on the pages on which the law is printed. The acts and resolves passed by the 94th legislature in regular session became effective August 6, 1949, except those laws which were passed as emergencies and became effective when approved by the Governor and those laws which state the date upon which they become effective. The effective date of each law is noted throughout this volume.
