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'Monroe Island Game Preserve. No person shall at any time hunt, pursue, molest, trap, catch, shoot at, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal on Monroe Island, in the township of Owl's Head, in the county of Knox.'

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## Chapter 55

### AN ACT Relating to Powers and Duties of County Commissioners Regarding Civil Defense.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 79, § 68-A, additional. Chapter 79 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 68-A, to read as follows:

#### 'Powers and Duties Regarding Civil Defense

Sec. 68-A. Civil defense. County commissioners shall have the power to provide for civil defense activities as provided by law within their respective counties. The cost thereof shall be included in the annual estimate of the county commissioners as provided for in section 13.'

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## Chapter 56

### AN ACT Relating to Costs of Children in Maine School for the Deaf.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 23, § 172-A, additional. Chapter 23 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 172-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 172-A. Costs. For each child admitted to the school, the town in which the child has a settlement, if any, shall pay to the state, to be credited to the general fund, an amount equal to the per capita cost of instruction and equipment in a public elementary school for a normal child in that town.'
