Chapter 121

AN ACT Relating to Representations of the State House in Liquor Advertising.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 59, amended. Section 59 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new sentence, to read as follows:

'No picture or other form of representation of the state house shall be used or displayed for the advertising of liquor.'

Chapter 122

AN ACT Relating to Inspection of Children's Homes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 243, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 243 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 177 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Said written statement to shall be furnished annually thereafter, in those cases where the home is licensed to board more than 2 children.'
