CHAP. 125

PUBLIC LAWS, 1951

'Upon approval of the county commissioners, uniforms required by this section, but not exceeding 2 for any 1 county, shall be furnished by the county.'

Chapter 124

AN ACT Relating to Apportionments from School Funds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 211-A, amended. Section 211-A of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 211-A. Apportionments to be made in December; exception. All apportionments to cities, towns, plantations, community school districts, academies and institutes under the provisions of this chapter, unless specifically directed by statute, shall be made annually in December, except that whenever the commissioner of education is satisfied that a financial need exists, and with the approval of the treasurer of state, an amount not to exceed 2/3 of the estimated subsidy may be paid on or after September 15.'

Chapter 125

AN ACT Relating to Published Records of Vital Statistics.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 38, § 21, amended. Section 21 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 21. Published records of vital statistics to be purchased. Whenever the record of the births, marriages and deaths of any town in the state, previous to the year 1892, beginning at the very earliest date, shall be collected from church records, church registers, records of clergymen, family Bibles, public records and other available sources, and shall be printed and verified in the manner required by the standing committee of the Maine Historical Society, under the editorship of some person selected by said committee, whose services shall be rendered free and without any compensation, and the work shall appear to them to have been prepared with ac-
