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## Chapter 140

### AN ACT Relating to Deposit of Potatoes into Waters of the State.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 72, § 9, amended. Section 9 of chapter 72 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 158 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 9. Deposit of potatoes into streams, etc. No person, firm, corporation or federal agency shall deposit or cause to be deposited potatoes or any part or parts thereof, except the potato pulp resulting from the manufacture of potato starch, into any stream, pond, lake or other body of water or water course, or on the ice thereof, or on the banks of the same where such potatoes, or any part or parts thereof, may pollute such waters. The provisions hereof shall not apply to industries licensed under this chapter.'

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## Chapter 141

### AN ACT Exempting Navy Clubs from Taxation.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 81, § 6, sub-§ III, amended. The 1st sentence of subsection III of section 6 of chapter 81 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All property which by the articles of separation is exempt from taxation; the personal property of all literary and scientific institutions; the real and personal property of all benevolent and charitable institutions incorporated by the state; the real estate of all literary and scientific institutions occupied by them for their own purposes or by any officer thereof as a residence; the real and personal property owned by posts of the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Grand Army of Republic, war with Spain, ~~and~~ Disabled American Veterans and Navy Clubs of the U. S. A. in this state and occupied or used solely by said posts for their own purposes; the real and personal property owned by chambers of commerce or boards of trade in this state and occupied or used solely by said chambers of commerce or boards of trade for their own purposes; the real and personal property owned by the American

National Red Cross in this state and occupied or used solely by said American National Red Cross for its own purposes; the real and personal property of all local chapters, situated in this state, of said American National Red Cross, where said property is occupied or used solely by said local chapters for their own purposes.'

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## Chapter 142

### AN ACT Relating to the Transmission of Television Signal by Wire.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Sec. 1. R. S., c. 46, § 3, amended.** The 1st sentence of section 3 of chapter 46 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Corporations for the operation of telegraphs or telephones, and corporations for the operation of both telegraphs and telephones, **and corporations for the transmission of television signals by wire**, and corporations for the purpose of making, generating, selling, distributing and supplying gas or electricity, or both, for lighting, heating, manufacturing or mechanical purposes, in any city or town, or two or more adjoining cities or towns, within the state, or for either or any of such purposes, may be organized under the provisions of sections 8 to 14, inclusive, of chapter 49.'

**Sec. 2. R. S., c. 46, § 11, amended.** Section 11 of chapter 46 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'**Sec. 11. Telegraph and telephone and certain television companies may pass along highways and across waters on route.** Every corporation organized hereunder for the purpose of operating telegraphs or telephones **or for the purpose of transmitting television signals by wire** may, except as herein limited, construct, maintain and operate its lines upon and along the route or routes and between the points stated in its certificate of incorporation; and may, subject to the conditions and under the restrictions provided in this chapter, construct its lines along, over, under, and across any of the roads and streets and across or under any of the waters upon and along such route or routes, with all necessary erections and fixtures therefor.'

Effective August 20, 1951
