Chapter 153

AN ACT to Authorize Towns to Own Scales.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 88, § 179, amended. The 1st sentence of section 179 of chapter 88 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Any city or town may purchase and keep for use scales for weighing hay and other articles, appoint weighers and fix their fees, to be paid by the purchaser.'

Chapter 154

AN ACT Creating Beauchamp Point Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 128, amended. Section 128 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto, in alphabetical order, a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'Beauchamp Point: No person shall at any time hunt, pursue, molest, trap, catch, shoot at, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal within the following described territory situated in Rockport and Camden, in the county of Knox: Beginning at the mouth of Goose river in Rockport; thence in a northerly direction along number 1 highway to the mouth of the Megunticook river in Camden; thence in a southerly direction along the coast around Metcalf Point and Beauchamp Point and thence in a northerly direction to the said Goose river.'

Chapter 155

AN ACT Relating to Membership in State Board of Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 1-A, repealed and replaced. Section 1-A of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 403 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 1-A. State board of education; expenses. The board, as heretofore created by previous enactment, shall consist of 10 members. The governor with the advice and consent of the council shall appoint 5 members representing each of the following groups and organizations which shall, in accordance with their particular by-laws or policies, submit 1 name, and if necessary, successive names, to the governor: 1 by the presidents of the liberal arts and teachers' colleges of the state, the person named not to be an active college president; 1 by the Maine municipal association, the person named not to be the active president of the association; 1 by the Maine superintendents' association, the person named not to be the active president of the association; 1 by the Maine congress of parents and teachers, the person named not to be the president of the organization; 1 by the Maine teachers' association, the person named not to be the president of the association; the other 5 members shall be appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council. The members shall serve for a term of 5 years and until their successors shall have been duly appointed and qualified. A vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in accordance with the provisions of the regular appointment. The members shall take the oath of office prescribed for state officers. Members of the board shall be subject to removal from office by the governor and council for cause. Members of the board shall serve without pay, other than their actual expenses while carrying out the functions of the board.'

Chapter 156

AN ACT Relating to Employed Persons in Paper Mills.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, §§ 55-60, repealed. Sections 55 to 60, inclusive, of chapter 22 of the revised statutes are hereby repealed.

Chapter 157

AN ACT Adding Korean Veterans to Laws Relating to Veterans.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22-A, § 10, sub-§ IV, amended. Subsection IV of section 10 of chapter 22-A of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of
