PUBLIC LAWS, 1951

Chapter 207

AN ACT Relating to Gambling.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 126, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 126 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Pool selling, book making and numbers game; penalty. Whoever engages or participates in pool selling, book making and numbers game, or aids or abets the same by his presence, unless the same is authorized by law, or whoever, owning or controlling any place of business wherein such activities or any part thereof are taking place, knowingly permits the same, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$2,000 and by imprisonment for not more than 2 years.'

Chapter 208

AN ACT Relating to Clerical Assistance for Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 91, § 4, amended. The last sentence of section 4 of chapter 91 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Each justice of said court shall be reimbursed by the state for expenses actually and reasonably incurred by him for clerical assistance, upon presentation to the state controller of an itemized statement of such expenses; but the total of such expenses of all of the justices of said court for elerical assistance shall not exceed \$15,000 in any 1 year.'

AN ACT Relating to Transportation of Poultry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
