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'Sec. 185-L. Application to certain carriers. The provisions of sections ~~211 to 236~~ 185-A to 185-L, inclusive, shall also include motor vehicles, including trucks, tractors and semi-trailers or any combination thereof, not operated as common and contract carriers and which are licensed for a load of in excess of over ~~7,000~~ 10,000 pounds or for a gross weight of in excess of over ~~10,000~~ 20,000 pounds. Such vehicles shall not be required to secure a permit from the public utilities commission.'

## Chapter 215

### AN ACT Permitting Closing of Banks on Saturday.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 55, § 141-A, amended. Section 141-A of chapter 55 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 345 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 141-A. Saturday closing permitted. Any savings bank, trust company, industrial bank, loan and building association, savings and loan association or credit union organized under the laws of the state of Maine, also any national banking association, federal savings and loan association, federal credit union or licensed small loan agency doing business in the state of Maine, may remain closed on any ~~or all Saturdays in the months of June, July, August and September~~ Saturdays as it may determine from time to time; and any Saturday on which such institution remains closed shall be, with respect to such institution, a holiday and not a business day.

Any act authorized, required or permitted to be performed at or by, or with respect to, any such institution on a Saturday ~~in June, July, August or September~~ on which the institution is closed may be so performed on the next succeeding business day and no liability or loss of rights of any kind shall result from such delay.'

## Chapter 216

### AN ACT Relating to the County Law Library of Franklin County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 79, § 151, amended. That part of section 151 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to payment to the county law library as-

sociation of Franklin county, as repealed and replaced by chapter 253 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Franklin, ~~\$750~~ \$1,250.'

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## Chapter 217

### AN ACT Relating to Closed Season on Pheasants.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 33, § 75, amended. Section 75 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding at the end of the 1st sentence thereof the following:

'; provided further, that there shall be a closed season on pheasants within the following described territory until September 30, 1955: all of Penobscot county north of a line drawn from the southwest corner of Aroostook county along route No. 157 and Millinocket lake road to Piscataquis county.'

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## Chapter 218

### AN ACT Relating to Junior Guides.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 33, § 28, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 28 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The commissioner shall appoint a board of ~~3~~ 4 members, 1 member of which shall be a Maine camp director, who shall serve without compensation, to be known as the "Junior Guides Examining Board." Appointments to said board shall be for 3 years or until successors are appointed.'
