Chapter 219

AN ACT Relating to Stamping of Meat for Human Consumption.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 188, amended. Section 188 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph to read as follows:

'All carcasses of meat from animals that are slaughtered in a licensed slaughterhouse in Maine and which are to be used for human consumption shall be stamped with the license number issued by the commissioner of agriculture to the licensed establishment, type and design of stamp to be approved by the commissioner. The meat shall be stamped on all parts that are to be portioned in wholesale cuts and the edible meat by-products shall be so stamped. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to meat or meat by-products bearing a federal stamp.'

Chapter 220

AN ACT Relating to Adulterated Meat or Meat Products.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 168, sub-§ VI-A, additional. Section 168 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding after subsection VI, a new subsection to be numbered VI-A, to read as follows:

'VI-A. In case of meat or meat products:

If any sodium sulphite, sodium bisulphite, or any drug, chemical, chemical compound or preservative from which sulphur dioxide can be liberated has been added thereto or mixed therewith.'
