of public welfare of the municipality of residence immediately upon receipt of an application. The notice shall contain the name and address of the applicant and the number of children for whom the grant is requested. The amount of aid which shall be granted for any dependent child shall be determined with due regard to the resources and necessary expenditures of the family and the conditions existing in each case on a budgetary basis in accordance with the rules and regulations of the department and shall be sufficient, when added to all other income and support available to the child, to provide such child with a reasonable subsistence compatible with decency and health.'

Chapter 279

AN ACT Relating to Non-Resident Dealers in Furs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 106, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 106 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The fee for the license shall be \$25 for residents of this state and ~~\$100~~ \$150 for non-residents, to be paid to the said commissioner.'

Chapter 280

AN ACT Relating to Dealers in Bait.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 55, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 55 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All persons dealing in live bait shall be licensed to do so by the commissioner, and the fee therefor shall be ~~\$2~~ \$5 for each calendar year. The license shall authorize the person holding the same to use the ordinary commercial type of minnow trap or the ordinary commercial type of minnow seine not to exceed 4 feet in depth by 25 feet in length, in the taking of minnows and other unprotected fish commonly used for bait purposes.'
