PUBLIC LAWS, 1951

Chapter 308

AN ACT Relating to Equal Pay for Women Teachers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 203-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 203-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 203-A. Equal pay for women teachers. In assigning salaries to teachers of public schools in the state, no discrimination shall be made between male and female teachers, with the same training and experience, employed in the same grade or performing the same kinds of duties. Any necessary adjustments shall be made prior to January 1, 1954.'

Chapter 309

AN ACT Relating to Hunting from Automobiles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 68, amended. The last sentence of section 68 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person excepting a law enforcement officer while in the line of duty or persons licensed as provided by section 18 of chapter 124 shall have a loaded rifle or loaded shotgun or a gun with a cartridge in the magazine thereof or a loaded revolver or loaded pistol with a barrel length of over 4 inches in or on any motor vehicle.'

AN ACT Relating to Emergency Lights on Police and Fire Department Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 34, amended. The last paragraph of section 34 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
