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## Chapter 329

AN ACT Relating to the Operation of Trucks During the Months of December, January and February.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 19, § 18, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 18 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Provided, however, that trucks for the registration of which a fee of \$100 or more has been paid, may be operated on the highways during the ~~month~~ months of December, ~~of the year in which such fee has been paid,~~ and during the months of January and February ~~of the year immediately following~~ with any overload; providing it is not in excess of the requirements of section 100.'

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## Chapter 330

AN ACT to Increase the Salaries of Members of the State Highway Commission.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 20, § 3, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 3 of chapter 20 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Each member of the state highway commission shall receive an annual salary of ~~\$3,500~~ \$4,000; they shall also receive their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties while away from their homes.'

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## Chapter 331

AN ACT Relating to Temporary Loans for Highway Purposes.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 15, § 22, amended. Section 22 of chapter 15 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof 2 new sentences to read as follows:

'The treasurer of state is further authorized, in any fiscal year in which the governor and council deem it necessary, to negotiate a temporary loan
