CHAP, 364

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 363

AN ACT Relating to Filing of Liens on Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 164, § 62, amended. The 1st sentence of section 62 of chapter 164 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The liens mentioned in the preceding section shall be dissolved unless the claimant within 30 days after the labor is performed, or storage furnished, files in the office of the clerk of the town in which the owner of such vehicle resides, or, when said owner is a non-resident of this state, in the registry of deeds or registry district of the county where the claimant resides, a true statement of the amount due him for such labor and materials, or for storage, with all just credits given, together with a description of the vehicle manufactured or repaired sufficiently accurate to identify it and the name of the owner, if known, which shall be subscribed and sworn to by the person claiming the lien or by some one in his behalf, and recorded in a book kept for that purpose by the clerk who is entitled to the same fees therefor as for recording mortgages.'

### Chapter 364

AN ACT Relating to Service Retirement Benefits Under State Employees'
Retirement Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S, c. 60, § 6-A, sub-§ IX, additional. Section 6-A of chapter 60 of the revised statutes, as revised by section 3 of chapter 384 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered IX, to read as follows:
  - IX. Any member of this retirement system may leave service after 30 years of creditable service and be entitled to a retirement allowance upon
