same by will, without the joinder or assent of ~~her~~ husband or wife; but such conveyance without the joinder or assent of the husband or wife shall not bar his or her right and interest by descent in the estate so conveyed. Real estate directly conveyed to ~~her~~ a wife by her husband cannot be conveyed by her without the joinder of her husband except real estate conveyed to her as security or in payment of a bona fide debt actually due to her from her husband. When payment was made for property conveyed to her from the property of her husband, or it was conveyed by him to her without a valuable consideration, it may be taken as the property of her husband to pay his debts contracted before such purchase.'

Chapter 376

AN ACT Relating to Prevention of Subversive Activity.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 130, § 3-A, additional. Chapter 130 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 3-A, to read as follows:

'Subversive Activity

Sec. 3-A. Advocating or aiding in overthrow of government by force or violence forbidden; penalty. Any person who advocates, aids or takes any active part in the overthrow by force and violence of the government of the United States or the state of Maine or any political subdivision thereof is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for not more than 5 years, or by a fine of not more than \$5,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'

AN ACT Relating to the Post-Audit of Maine Forestry District and Maine Port Authority.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 16, § 3, sub-§ V, amended. Subsection V of section 3 of chapter 16 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
