or shall be construed as repealing, the whole or any part of any existing statute, and all rights and duties herein mentioned shall be exercised and performed in accordance with all the applicable provisions of chapter 40 of the revised statutes of 1944, and all acts amendatory thereof or additional thereto.

Sec. 15. Emergency clause; effective date; referendum. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the town of Freeport who are inhabitants of said district at a meeting called by the selectmen of the town of Freeport at some place within said district as fixed by said selectmen at such time as the selectmen shall fix, but within 60 days of the effective date of this act. Said meeting shall be warned in the same mannier as town meetings are warned in said town. The board of registration shall prepare and furnish separate check lists for such of the voters within said district as are then legal voters of said town and reside in said district, and all notices, warrants or other proceedings shall be varied accordingly so as to show that only such voters as reside in said district as aforesaid are entitled to vote at such meeting. At such meeting the vote shall be by ballot bearing the question "Shall the act to incorporate the Porter's Landing Water District be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. This act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at said meeting; provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this act equals or exceeds 20% of the number of voters on said check list. The result in said district shall be declared by the selectmen of the town of Freeport and due certificate thereof filed by the town clerk with the secretary of state.

Chapter 105

AN ACT Relating to Powers of the Housing Authority of Presque Isle.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Powers of Housing Authority in Presque Isle. The Housing Authority of Presque Isle is hereby authorized to acquire, manage and maintain the housing projects known as Braden Terrace and Fairview Acres for any purpose permitted in the transfer agreement between it and the Federal Public Housing Authority.
