Whenever such regulations are thus provided for, they shall be promulgated by the municipal officers of the towns of Phippsburg and West Bath and the city of Bath and a copy of the same filed immediately with the clerks of said towns and city and the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries.

If in any year said towns and city fail to act as provided for in the preceding paragraph, the taking of alewives in said waters shall be in accordance with the provisions of the general laws of the state and any regulations adopted under authority of this chapter shall be enforced by the municipal officers of the towns of Phippsburg and West Bath and the city of Bath.

If, after thorough investigation, it is the opinion of the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries that the towns and city are not following sound conservation principles in their management of the fishery, said commissioner shall notify the city and town officials of his findings and they shall take immediate corrective measures to prevent destruction of the fishery.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this chapter or any regulations promulgated hereunder shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, or by imprisonment for 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Chapter 120

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire of the Lewiston Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1921, c. 128, § 1, amended. The 1st sentence of section 1 of chapter 128 of the private and special laws of 1921, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'The clerk of the municipal court for the city of Lewiston shall receive an annual salary of \$2,300, with ~~\$2,000~~ \$2,260 additional for clerk hire from said city in monthly payments, which sum shall be in full compensation for the performance of all duties required of said clerk by law.'
