838 ENLARGING WISCASSET ACADEMY'S POWERS CHAP. 133 PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1951 as may be prescribed by the commission. After 5 years of service such permanent members shall be entitled to 3 weeks' vacation each year with pay at such time as may be prescribed by the commission.'

Chapter 132

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Shellfish and Marine Worms in the Town of Freeport.

Chapter 133

AN ACT Enlarging the Powers of Wiscasset Academy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1899, c. 159, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 159 of the private and special laws of 1899 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Powers, rights and privileges. Said corporation is hereby vested with all the powers, rights, privileges and immunities incident to similar corporations, may have and use a common seal, prosecute and defend suits at law, make and establish by-laws and regulations for the management of its affairs and the proper government of the academy, not repugnant to the constitution and laws of the state, and hold estate, real and personal, which it may now have, or may hereafter receive by gift, grant, devise, purchase or otherwise, to an amount not exceeding two hundredthousand dollars \$500,000.'
