PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1951

CHAP. 150

This act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at said meeting; provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this act equals or exceeds 20% of the total number of names on the check lists used at said meeting. The result in said district shall be declared by the selectmen of the town of Wells and due certificate thereof filed by the town clerk with the secretary of state.

Chapter 150

AN ACT to Increase the Salary of the Judge and Recorder of the Rumford Falls Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1907, c. 429, § 1, amended. The 1st sentence of section 1 of chapter 429 of the private and special laws of 1907, as amended by chapter 104 of the private and special laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

The judge of the Rumford Falls Municipal Court shall receive an annual salary of \$2,200 \$2,400, payable quarterly out of the county treasury of the county of Oxford, on the 1st days of July, October, January and April, which shall be in full payment for his services as such judge.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1907, c. 429, § 2, amended. The last paragraph of section 2 of chapter 429 of the private and special laws of 1907 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'For all such services by said recorder performed and rendered and for his services in acting during the absence or inability of the judge of said Rumford Falls Municipal Court, said recorder shall receive the sum of five hundred dollars \$800, payable quarterly out of the county treasury of said county of Oxford on the 1st days of July, October, January and April of each year.'
