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**Private and Special Laws**

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64 of the private and special laws of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'For all services performed the said recorder shall receive from the county of Cumberland an annual salary of \$1,000 and \$600 annually additional for clerk hire, to be paid him in quarterly payments.'

## Chapter 170

AN ACT Relating to the Building Inspector of the City of Lewiston.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XII, § 1, amended. Section 1 of article XII of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Responsibilities. The fire department shall be charged with the responsibility for fire prevention, fire protection, annual fire inspection and the extinguishment of fires; ~~building inspection and the issuing of building permits;~~ and the control and inspection of electric wiring, equipment and appliances.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XII, § 4, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 4 of article XII of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as repealed and replaced by chapter 44 of the private and special laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'They may also appoint ~~an inspector of buildings~~ an inspector of electric wiring, equipment and appliances, and such clerks and assistants to these officials as they may deem necessary, prescribe their duties, set their compensation subject to the approval of the board of finance, and terminate their employment at pleasure.'

## Chapter 171

AN ACT Relating to Board of Education of City of Lewiston.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XIII, § 2, amended. The 1st sentence of section 2 of article XIII of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The board of education existing when this charter takes effect shall be and continue as the board of education herein established, the members thereof to serve in accordance with their respective appointments without interruption and the mayor shall annually appoint a member for the term of 5 years to take office on the 1st day of May next succeeding. The terms of office of the members of the present board of education shall terminate on the 3rd Monday of March of the 5th year next following their appointment.'

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## Chapter 172

### AN ACT Relating to Expenses of the Brunswick Municipal Court.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 277, § 12, amended. Section 12 of chapter 277 of the private and special laws of 1903 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 12. Court room, how provided. The ~~town of Brunswick~~ county commissioners of Cumberland county shall provide and furnish a suitable ~~court room~~ place in the town of Brunswick for the purpose of holding said court therein, and shall heat and light the same. All other expenses of said court, including blank books of record, docket and blanks necessary for the use of said court, shall be paid from the treasury of the county of Cumberland.'

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## Chapter 173

### AN ACT Relating to Salaries of the Judge and Recorder of the Ellsworth Municipal Court.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1876, c. 298, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 298 of the private and special laws of 1876, as amended by section 1 of chapter 36 of the private and special laws of 1929, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Salary of judge. The police court of the city of Ellsworth, in the county of Hancock, shall be hereafter styled the Ellsworth Municipal
