compensation, but shall be reimbursed, as hereinafter provided, for their necessary expenses incurred while serving as a member of said board. Said board, together with the county commissioners of said Cumberland county shall study the present needs for repairs and maintenance of said bridge as now existing, and the advisability of construction of a bridge at a location and of a height that will make unnecessary the construction and maintenance of a draw for the passage of vessels; and for said purposes the state highway commission shall employ its engineers and may, if it deems advisable, consult with other engineers specially experienced in bridge design and construction, and shall obtain estimates of cost.

Said board shall make a report to the Governor and Council of its findings and recommendations not later than November 30, 1951.

Any expenses incurred by said board, including necessary expenses of the members of the board, except officials and employees of the state highway commission and Portland Terminal Company, while engaged in the duties of the board, and the expenses of any necessary or emergency repairs or replacements to said bridge, shall be paid by the county treasurer on written order of the county commissioners, from the Bridge Repair and Reconstruction Fund authorized by chapter 131 of the private and special laws of 1949.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 191

AN ACT Relating to Uniforms for Members of Police Department of the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 7-A, additional. Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 7-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 7-A. Uniforms for members. The city shall supply male members of the police department with necessary uniforms, but shall not expend more than \$100 per member annually. The provisions of this section shall apply only to those who have been members of the police department for at least 3 years.'
