## Chapter 4

### RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of St. Agatha.

Town of St. Agatha; debt cancelled. Resolved: That the county commissioners of Aroostook county be, and hereby are, authorized to cancel the debt up to January 1, 1950, for excise taxes for motor vehicles received from persons residing in unorganized territory.

## Chapter 5

### RESOLVE, in Favor of Herbert L. Bryant, of Houlton.

Herbert L. Bryant; to be given credit. Resolved: That Herbert L. Bryant, of Houlton, be given credit for 1 full year of teaching service rendered in Hebron Academy, to be applied toward meeting requirements for retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

## Chapter 6

### RESOLVE, Relating to Digging of Clams in the Town of Harrington.

Digging of clams in town of Harrington, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation providing that any person not a resident of the town of Harrington, in the county of Washington, for 3 months is forbidden to dig more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  bushel of clams within 1 day within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and be it further

Resolves, 1939, c. 3, repealed. Resolved: That chapter 3 of the resolves of 1939 is hereby repealed.
