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## Chapter 10

### RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Sheepscot Bay.

Fishing in Sheepscot bay, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to repeal the rule and regulation relating to fishing for cod and other ground fish in Sheepscot bay and issue the following rule and regulation in place thereof:

'Fishing for cod and other ground fish in Sheepscot bay regulated. It shall be unlawful to fish for or to take, except with trawls or by ordinary hook and line, any cod or other ground fish from the waters of Sheepscot bay that border on the town of Georgetown in the county of Sagadahoc, and the town of Southport in the county of Lincoln, from Griffiths Head in an easterly direction to lower Mark Island, thence in a southerly direction to the Cuckholds, thence in a northeasterly direction to Ocean Point.'

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## Chapter 11

### RESOLVE, in Favor of the Plantation of Moose River.

Plantation of Moose River; money reallocated. Resolved: That the money appropriated in favor of the plantation of Moose River by previous legislatures which was originally designated to be used on the Sandy Stream road, so called, be, and hereby is, reappropriated to be used in connection with state aid money on route 201.

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## Chapter 12

### RESOLVE, to Remove the Bag Limit and Size Limit on White Perch in Sebago Lake, Songo River, Bay of Naples and Long Lake.

Bag limit and size limit on white perch in certain waters, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation providing that there shall be no bag limit or size limit on white perch taken in Sebago lake, Songo river, Bay of Naples (Brandy pond) and Long lake, all in the county of Cumberland.
