Chapter 19

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in the Tributaries to Bemis Stream in the County of Franklin.

Fishing in tributaries to Bemis stream, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing to all fishing the tributaries to Bemis stream in the county of Franklin.

Effective August 20, 1951

Chapter 20

RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Mildred S. Dow of Scarborough.

Mildred S. Dow; pension for. Resolved: That Mildred S. Dow, of Scarborough, be given credit for an additional 1 year of teaching service so that she may be entitled to a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

Chapter 21

RESOLVE, to Open Black Pond, in the County of Oxford.

Regulating fishing in Black pond in the county of Oxford. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Black pond in the town of Sweden in the county of Oxford to ice fishing from the time ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring.

Chapter 22

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing on Rangeley Stream in the County of Franklin.

Fishing on Rangeley stream, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and di-

rected to issue a rule and regulation establishing red posts on opposite shores of Rangeley stream indicating the point on Rangeley stream where Rangeley lake ends and Rangeley stream begins.

Chapter 23

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Upper Dam Pool, County of Oxford.

Fishing in Upper Dam Pool, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily limit of 4 fish per day per person and the minimum length of trout 8 inches on Upper Dam Pool in the county of Oxford.

Chapter 24

RESOLVE, Authorizing the State Tax Assessor to Convey by Sale Certain Interest of the State in Land with Buildings Thereon in Newcastle, in the County of Lincoln.

State tax assessor authorized to convey land and buildings. Resolved: That the state tax assessor be, and hereby is, authorized to convey by sale for not less than \$100 certain interest of the state in land with buildings thereon, situated in Newcastle, in the county of Lincoln, such sale of the following described parcel of property with buildings thereon to be made to the highest bidder; provided that notice of such sale be published 3 times, once each week for 3 consecutive weeks in some newspaper in the county where such land lies:

Beginning at a point in the stone wall marking the northerly bound of land formerly of Edward Robinson, now of the heirs of Obed Curtis, about 12 rods westerly from the highway leading from "Clark's Corner," so-called, to "Robinson's Corner," so-called; thence northerly, at right angles to said stone wall, about 25 rods, to a stake; thence, on a line parallel with said stone wall, easterly, crossing said road, about 25 rods, to a stake; thence, on a line parallel with the first described line, southerly, about 25 rods, to a stone wall marking the northerly line of land of said heirs of Obed Curtis; thence westerly, crossing said road, by said stone wall, to the point of beginning.
