Chapter 25

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Coffee Pond, Cumberland County.

Fishing in Coffee pond; regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Coffee pond in the town of Casco, county of Cumberland, to all fishing until April 15, 1953.

Effective August 20, 1951

Chapter 26

RESOLVE, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Liberalize Limitation of Municipal Indebtedness.

Repealed by Resolves, 1951, c. 119.

Chapter 27

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Grace Pond in Enchanted Township.

Grace pond, fishing regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Grace pond, in Enchanted Township, in Somerset county, to fly fishing only.

Effective August 20, 1951

Chapter 28

RESOLVE, Relating to Flagstaff Pond in the County of Somerset.

Flagstaff pond, relating to. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation cancelling all existing rules and regulations on Flagstaff pond, in the county of Somerset.
