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## Chapter 33

## RESOLVE, for the Laying of the County Taxes for the Years Nineteen Hundred Fifty-one and Nineteen Hundred Fifty-two.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, the several counties hereinafter named, have certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, the several counties have no source of revenue except the taxes hereinafter mentioned; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1951 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed, in order to provide the required revenue for the several counties; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

**County taxes apportioned. Resolved:** That the sum appearing opposite to the names of the counties in the following schedule is hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same and for other purposes of law, for the years 1951 and 1952.

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### Chapter 34

#### RESOLVE, Relating to Working Capital for Institutional Farms.

Resolves, 1949, c. 109, amended. Chapter 109 of the resolves of 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Working capital for institutional farms. Resolved: That there be set aside from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund the sum of ~~\$50,000~~ \$30,000 to be used for working capital advances to the institutional farms. ~~Any advances made to any institutional farm shall be returned within a years time.~~ Transfers may be made within the various farm accounts upon approval of the governor and council.'

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### Chapter 35

#### RESOLVE in Favor of Caswell Plantation.

Caswell plantation; money reallocated. Resolved: That the money appropriated in favor of Caswell plantation, by the 93rd and 94th legislatures for the repair of the Richardson road, so called and for the repair of the Batiste Parent road, so called; work to begin where work ended under previous special resolve be, and hereby is, reappropriated to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1952, as follows: To aid in repairing the Griffin road, so called, work to begin at the intersection of the Griffin road with the Willard road and extending in a northerly direction.
