CHAP. 53

Chapter 51

RESOLVE, Closing Pleasant Lake and Its Tributaries to Dipping or Netting of Smelts.

Pleasant lake and its tributaries closed to smelt dipping or netting. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Pleasant lake and its tributaries, in the town of Island Falls, to dipping or netting of smelts.

Effective August 20, 1951

Chapter 52

RESOLVE, Closing Certain Ponds in Dedham and Bucksport, in Hancock County, to Fishing.

Certain ponds in Dedham and Bucksport, in Hancock county, closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Moulton pond, Mitchell pond, Goose pond and Second pond, all in the towns of Dedham and Bucksport, in Hancock county, to all fishing until April 15, 1953.

The commissioner of inland fisheries and game is further authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of not more than 5 fish in said ponds in Hancock county, after April 15, 1953.

Chapter 53

RESOLVE, Closing Three Mile Pond to Ice Fishing.

Three Mile pond; closed to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close Three Mile pond in the towns of China, Windsor and Vassalboro, Kennebec county, to ice fishing for a period of 2 years.
