Chapter 61

RESOLVE to Repeal Certain Special Resolve Pensions.

Chapter 62

RESOLVE, Authorizing Expenditure of Certain Moneys in Possession of Bangor State Hospital.

Certain moneys in possession of Bangor state hospital; expenditure authorized. Resolved: That the superintendent of the Bangor state hospital be, and hereby is, authorized to expend for the benefit and welfare of the patients of said hospital such part of the cash balance of the patients' cash deposit account as may be represented by interest earnings on said deposit plus such parts of the cash deposit account as may be represented by unclaimed deposits; provided, however, that all unclaimed deposits so used must have remained unclaimed for not less than 5 years; and provided further, that the superintendent of the hospital shall have made every reasonable attempt to locate the owners of said unclaimed deposits; and

provided further, that the balance shall at no time be drawn down to less than \$250.

Chapter 63

RESOLVE, Authorizing Forest Commissioner to Renew Lease to Passamaquoddy Lumber Company.

Forest commissioner authorized to renew lease. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized and empowered to renew the lease dated December 6, 1950 whereby the state of Maine did lease unto the Passamaquoddy Lumber Company a piece of land in Indian township for a period of 3 years, said renewal to be in accordance with the terms and conditions described in said lease.

Chapter 64

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Sebec.

Town of Sebec; money reallocated. Resolved: That the sum of \$500 appropriated in favor of the town of Sebec, by the 93rd legislature for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1949, for the repair and reconstruction of the state aid road leading from Sebec corner to Sebec Station, beginning at a point a few rods north of Meadow Brook bridge, so called, and extending in a southerly direction to Sebec Station, nearly .5 of a mile in length be, and hereby is, reappropriated to be expended to aid in repairing the road leading from Sebec Station toward East Dover.
