CHAP. 73

RESOLVES, 1951

Resolves 1951, c. 33, amended. Resolved: That that part of chapter 33 of the resolves of 1951 which relates to Cumberland county be, and hereby is, amended to read as follows:

'Cumberland ~~467,197.00~~ 358,631.00 ~~487,495.00~~ 384,935.00'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
